

Welcome

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome all First Responders to the 5th Annual Sissonville Fire & Rescue School. In 2010, the school was a huge success with over 700 students trained in 37 classes. This event will once again be held at Sissonville High School located at 6100 Sissonville Drive, Charleston, WV 25312.

Tuition Discount

If you Register for a Two Day class EACH weekend you will get a discount of \$25.00 making your total tuition cost of \$125.00. This discount does not include the Multiple Weekend courses (eg. Firefighter 1, Fire Officer 1 / 2, etc.). Fees for any additional classes must still be added to the total tuition cost.

Registration

All students should Pre-Register by the February 21, 2011 deadline to receive a free Fire School Tee Shirt. Pre-Registration for the 4-Weekend classes (Firefighter I and EMT-Basic) will be 7 days prior to class start date. All Registrations must be pre-paid or they will not be accepted.

Refunds

Registrations are on a first come—first served basis and no class slots will be held without a paid registration. Only a 50% refund will be given until seven days prior to your class beginning. Absolutely no refunds will be given after that date unless ALL THREE of your class selections are full or canceled.

Directions

From Parkersburg: Take 1-77 South to Tupper's Creek Exit 111. Make a right at the bottom of ramp onto Call Rd. Go approximately 1.5 miles to stop sign and make a Right turn on Sissonville Dr. (CR-21). Go approximately 1.5 miles to the stop light in front of Sissonville High School and make a left onto Martins Branch Rd. Go 50 yards and make the left hand turn to enter the Sissonville High School parking lot.

From Morgantown: Take I-79 South to I-77/I-79 split. Take I-77 North to Tupper's Creek Exit 111. Make a left at the bottom of ramp onto Call Rd. Go approximately 1.5 miles to stop sign and make a Right turn on Sissonville Dr. (CR-21). Go approximately 1.5 miles to the stop light in front of Sissonville High School and make a left onto Martins Branch Rd. Go 50 yards and make the left hand turn to enter the Sissonville High School parking lot.

From Beckley: Take 1-77 North through Charleston to Tupper's Creek Exit 111. Make a left at the bottom of ramp onto Call Rd. Go approximately 1.5 miles to stop sign and make a Right turn on Sissonville Dr. (CR-21). Go approximately 1.5 miles to the stop light in front of Sissonville High School and make a left onto Martins Branch Rd. Go 50 yards and make the left hand turn to enter the Sissonville High School parking lot.

From Huntington: Take I-64 East to Cross Lanes Exit 47B. Continue on Goff Mountain Rd. through traffic light onto Big Tyler Rd. Go approximately 5 miles to traffic light at Rocky Fork Rd. and make a left. Go approximately 4 miles until a fork in the road at intersection of Kelly's Creek Rd. and Martins Branch Rd. Make a right onto Martins Branch Rd. and go approximately 4 miles and Sissonville High School will be on right just before the traffic light at Sissonville Dr. (CR-21).

Health and Wellness Advocate Workshop: The National Volunteer Fire Council Heart-Healthy Firefighter Program, in partnership with L&T Health and Fitness, will host a free Health and Wellness Advocate Workshop. This program is designed to combat the leading cause of line-of-duty firefighter deaths – heart attack – by creating health and wellness advocates within fire/EMS departments. Fire and EMS personnel who are interested in health and wellness and have the ability to lead and motivate others are invited to take part in the Workshop. No more than 30 individuals total will be able to participate in the Workshop – which is approximately 14-16 hours in length over a two day period of time. Each individual should have the support of department leadership. The Workshop focuses on the basic principles behind developing a sound health and wellness program and trains first responders to become advocates within their department. As Health and Fitness Advocates, they will encourage and motivate their fellow fire and emergency personnel to adopt heart-healthy behaviors. Each advocate will leave with an instructor kit and a Fit Kit to take back to his/her department.


