This is a blended learning course for initial Emergency Medical Technician (EMT). This EMT course will cover the content necessary for students to take the practical skills and written examinations for EMT certification. If you are a self-motivated, goal-oriented student who enjoys being challenged, then this is a great educational opportunity. If you are looking for an easy route to EMT Certification, then this course is NOT for you. Additional fees will need to be paid to the appropriate agencies for background checks and testing fees.

This is a VERY accelerated online EMT course. The student must be ready to work and be willing to work on this course nearly every day. The course will begin on March 1, 2019 at 6pm and students will have in-class dates of March 2, March 3, March 8, March 9, March 10, March 30, March 31, April 5, April 6, and April 7. On days not listed the student will be responsible for completing all the online course modules and obtaining the required patient contacts and ambulance ride time. Class begins at 6pm on Fridays and 8am on Saturdays and Sundays.

#### FIRE FIGHTER 1 (Online)

#### Course 002



This course is designed to meet the job performance requirements of NFPA 1001. Students will learn the fundamentals of firefighting skills through this blended learning course which will combine online learning with intense practical application. The course is designed to assist students with obtaining certification through a self-paced style of instruction and includes certification in Firefighter Level 1, First Aid and CPR, Hazardous Materials Awareness, and Hazardous Materials Operations.

Students must attend one of the two orientation weekends to attend this course at the fire school. Those dates are January 12th and 13th OR February 2nd and 3rd.

This is a Blended Learning class that requires independent study and a commitment to learning. Students will be given their text and a Course Access code at the first meeting. Students are expected to complete all of the on-line assignments and read the requisite course materials to be prepared to test on Sunday, March 10, 2019.

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#### HAZARDOUS MATERIALS TECHNICIAN

#### Tuition: \$200.00 Instructor: Mike Daley Textbook: \$105.00 Prerequisite: HazMat Ops

Hazardous Materials Technician prepares Operations-level responders for Technician-level Hazardous Materials certification. This course, based on NFPA 472 standards, provides participants with HAZMAT-specific response knowledge and skills, enabling them to respond safely and effectively to a suspected incident at the hazardous materials technician level. Participants receive hands-on training in donning and doffing Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Levels A and B, containing leaks and drum over-packing, containing leaks in pressurized containers, and performing technical and mass decontamination. The course culminates with performance of these offensive-level tasks in an activity in which the participants apply the knowledge and skills learned in a simulated HAZMAT environment.

This NFPA 1041 course will train participants to teach a class from a prepared lesson plan as well as the ability to develop goals and objectives for course success. This course introduces the student to the concept of utilizing training aids to enhance his/her presentation, and how to properly select and use these training aids. The student will give several presentations during the week, all leading to the twenty-minute graded presentation on the final day.

Upon Successful completion of this course students will be issued certification for Instructor 1 & 2; however, this does not quarantee employment with WV PST or West Virginia University - Fire Service Extension.

#### RESCUE CORE

#### Instructor: Darin Virag

Tuition: \$150.00 Textbook: \$110.00 Prerequisite: None

This course is the Introduction to Technical Rescue and goes into rope rescue techniques which will include a classroom review of equipment, knots, and rope safety. Instruction events include: establishing need for rope rescue; uses and limitations of equipment; knotcraft; safety aspects; basic anchoring systems; lowering systems and other aspects of rope rescue. The class meets the requirements of NFPA 1006 Chapter 5, prerequisite for all other technical rescue subjects upon successful completion. At the conclusion of the course, the student will be trained and have certificates for Vehicle and Machinery Extrication Awareness, Wilderness Search and Rescue Awareness, Rope Rescue Awareness and Rope Rescue Operations to the NFPA Standard 1006, 2017 edition.



# Highway Pile-Up Managing the MCI

March 9 & 10, 2019 | 8am to 5pm Sissonville, West Virginia



The scenario in this course will involve approximately 40 passenger vehicles, Tractor Trailer(s), other hazards, and approximately 40 patients.

Multi-Vehicle pile ups are happening at an alarming rate each year around the country. From a dozen to over a hundred vehicles is not uncommon. These incidents are complex, multifaceted, and resource demanding. This program has been developed to help departments and agencies cope and plan for such a disaster.

This course will capture complex extrication scenarios, combined with BLS and ALS medical interventions for MCI, as well as incident command strategies for chief officers or incident commanders all rolled into one program.

This course is for Firefighters, EMTs, Paramedics, and Incident Commanders.





**From Parkersburg**: Take I-77 South to Tupper's Creek Exit III. Make a right at the bottom of ramp onto Call Rd. Go approximately 1.5 miles to stop sign and make a Right turn on Sissonville Dr. (CR-21). Go approximately 1.5 miles to the stop light in front of Sissonville High School and make a left onto Martins Branch Rd. Go 50 yards and make the left hand turn to enter the Sissonville High School parking lot.

**From Morgantown**: Take I-79 South to I-77/I-79 split. Take I-77 North to Tupper's Creek Exit 111. Make a left at the bottom of ramp onto Call Rd. Go approximately 1.5 miles to stop sign and make a Right turn on Sissonville Dr. (CR-21). Go approximately 1.5 miles to the stop light in front of Sissonville High School and make a left onto Martins Branch Rd. Go 50 yards and make the left hand turn to enter the Sissonville High School parking lot.

**From Beckley:** Take I-77 North through Charleston to Tupper's Creek Exit 111. Make a left at the bottom of ramp onto Call Rd. Go approximately 1.5 miles to stop sign and make a Right turn on Sissonville Dr. (CR-21). Go approximately 1.5 miles to the stop light in front of Sissonville High School and make a left onto Martins Branch Rd. Go 50 yards and make the left hand turn to enter the Sissonville High School parking lot.

**From Huntington**: Take 1-64 East to Cross Lanes Exit 47B. Continue on Goff Mountain Rd. through traffic light onto Big Tyler Rd. Go approximately 5 miles to traffic light at Rocky Fork Rd. and make a left. Go approximately 4 miles until a fork in the road at intersection of Kelly's Creek Rd. and Martins Branch Rd. Make a right onto Martins Branch Rd. and go approximately 4 miles and Sissonville High School will be on right just before the traffic light at Sissonville Dr. (CR-21).
