



FIRE FIGHTER 1 (Online)

Instructor: Jason Redden

Tuition, Textbook & Online Access Code: \$540.00 Prerequisite: None

This course is designed to meet the job performance requirements of NFPA 1001. Students will learn the fundamentals of firefighting skills through this blended learning course which will combine online learning with intense practical application. The course is designed to assist students with obtaining certification through a self-paced style of instruction and includes certification in Firefighter Level 1, First Aid and CPR, Hazardous Materials Awareness, and Hazardous Materials Operations.

Students must attend the orientation weekend to attend this course at the fire school. The orientation weekend will be held on February 4 & 5, 2023 at the Sissonville Fire Department - Main Station - 383 Call Road, Charleston, WV 25312. Students must attend both days.

This class will meet on February 4, February 5, March 3, March 4, March 5, March 10, March 11, and March 12. On Friday's, class will begin at 6pm and on Saturday's and Sunday's class will begin at 8am.

This is a Blended Learning class that requires independent study and a commitment to learning. Students will be given their text and a Course Access code at the first meeting. Students are expected to complete all of the on-line assignments and read the requisite course materials to be prepared to test on Sunday, March 12, 2023.

The course is designed to assist students with obtaining certification and includes certification in Firefighter Level 1, First Aid and CPR, Hazardous Materials Awareness, and Hazardous Materials Operations.

This course will be in the classroom without any online learning. Students will multiple weekends to complete this course. Students will meet March 3-5 and March 10-12 at Sissonville High School. The remaining weekends - March 18 & 19, March 25 & 26, April 1 & 2, and April 15 & 16 - will be held at the Sissonville Fire Department main station located at 383 Call Road, Charleston, WV 25312.

Driver / Operator Pumper

This program will identify emergency service personnel who demonstrate competency in the performance requirements necessary to perform the duties of a firefighter. The NFPA 1002 Standard for Fire Apparatus Driver/Operator Professional Qualifications identifies the minimum requirements for firefighters who drive and operate fire apparatus in both emergency and non-emergency situations. A person certified at the Pumper Driver/Operator level will have demonstrated competency in the necessary knowledge and skills, to perform the minimum requirements of an emergency vehicle driver/operator.

This course prepares Public Safety Personnel to begin the process of starting a UAS / Drone program in their agency as well as to sit for the FAA Part 107 Remote Pilot exam. This course will consist of 40-hours of study. The first 24 hours will consist of classroom study and the remaining 16-hours will consist of hands on basic flight training and will end with hands-on training and flying in simulated real life scenarios. All hands-on training will be done flying aircraft similar to what may actually be used in the field.

This approximately 155-Hour Hybrid EMT program is the basic level of EMT care by the West Virginia Office of Emergency Medical Services. This class meets the National Standards Curriculum. The EMT candidate must successfully complete the program, complete required clinical time, complete the practical skills testing, and obtain a passing score on the written examination. Students must be self motivated to complete assignments and spend time studying outside of formal class hours.

The course requires a clinical component to be completed outside of class hours during which you will ride along with an EMS agency to complete patient assessments. These assessments must be completed in order to obtain certification as an EMT. You will receive more information on the clinical component during the class. Upon successful completion of the course, you will be eligible to sit for the National Registry of EMTs exam. The cost of the examination is not included in your tuition.

This course is designed to meet the job performance requirements of NFPA 1021. It identifies the requirements necessary to perform the duties of a first-line to mid-level supervisor. Introduces the student to the concepts of management and supervision on such topics as: Organizational Structure, Communication Skills, Human Resource Management, Public Relations, Planning, Emergency Service Delivery, Safety, information management, government structure, and department budget planning and management.



INSTRUCTOR 1 & 2

Instructor: David Plume Tuition: \$250.00 Textbook: \$80.00

Prerequisite: Fire Fighter 1, Fire Fighter 2, and HazMat Operations OR EMT

This NFPA 1041 course will train participants to teach a class from a prepared lesson plan as well as the ability to develop goals and objectives for course success. This course introduces the student to the concept of utilizing training aids to enhance his/her presentation, and how to properly select and use these training aids. The student will give several presentations during the week, all leading to the twenty-minute graded presentation on the final day.

Upon Successful completion of this course students will be issued certification for Instructor 1 & 2; however, this does not guarantee employment with WV Public Service Training or West Virginia University - Fire Service Extension.

This technical rescue training program will consist of Trench Rescue Awareness, Trench Rescue Operations and Trench Rescue Technician certification. This course is the most advanced level of training outlined in the NFPA 1670 and 1006 Standards. It is designed for emergency rescue personnel responsible for rescue and recovery operations in more complex environments. Students will work in intersecting "T" and "L" trenches as well as trenches greater than 8 feet in depth. This hands-on course provides training in real life scenarios allowing the student to gain confidence in this dangerous environment. Some skills taught include Rescuer safety, understanding OSHA regulations involving trenches and excavations; Preplanning; Assessing soil composition and configuration; Cave-in evaluation; Stabilization and shoring; Mechanical, hydraulic, and pneumatic shores; Victim rescue and recovery; and Incident termination. This is a physical and mentally demanding program that emphasizes scene management, safety, and teamwork.

ART OF READING SMOKE

Often, smoke from a building is the only clue available to predict fire behavior and the likelihood of a flashover or rapid fire spread. First-arriving officers, Incident Commanders, and Safety Officers must know how to rapidly read smoke. This class explains the reading-smoke process and gives participants practice using actual fire-ground video.

Can't meet your objectives to control the incident? The solution is an effective command system to manage resources and personnel from the time the alarm is dispatched until command is terminated. In addition, students will also write a grant during the class and compete for an award that is sponsored by a local business.

This course was designed around rescue teams that are expected to affect a rescue with limited personnel and resources. In the Urban and Wilderness rescue worlds, we can't always bring more people to help solve a complex problem. In many jurisdictions and into rural/wilderness rescue, you may be personnel and equipment limited. The goal of this workshop is to explore the world outside the G-rated toolbox. Standards are created for specific reasons. The NFPA General use standard differs than the Technical use standard. As a rescuer and their team become more proficient in their skills, they have the ability to adopt other standards and best practices that may be better suited for their rescue environment. In addition, focus will be placed on utilizing rope autonomy to lighten rescue loads and be able to accomplish more, with less. Teams will work through rescue scenarios showing how the team can accomplish the goal of rescue and treatment with specific role management.



Go approximately 1.5 miles to stop sign and make a Right turn on Sissonville Dr. (CR-21). Go approximately 1.5 miles to the stop light in front of Sissonville High School and make a left onto Martins Branch Rd. Go 50 yards and make the left hand turn to enter the Sissonville High School parking lot.

From Morgantown: Take I-79 South to I-77/I-79 split. Take I-77 North to Tupper's Creek Exit 111. Make a left at the bottom of ramp onto Call Rd. Go approximately 1.5 miles to stop sign and make a Right turn on Sissonville Dr. (CR-21). Go approximately 1.5 miles to the stop light in front of Sissonville High School and make a left onto Martins Branch Rd. Go 50 yards and make the left hand turn to enter the Sissonville High School parking lot.

From Beckley: Take I-77 North through Charleston to Tupper's Creek Exit 111. Make a left at the bottom of ramp onto Call Rd. Go approximately 1.5 miles to stop sign and make a Right turn on Sissonville Dr. (CR-21). Go approximately 1.5 miles to the stop light in front of Sissonville High School and make a left onto Martins Branch Rd. Go 50 yards and make the left hand turn to enter the Sissonville High School parking lot.
